Important Notes:

- ★ It is the <u>student's responsibility</u> to have their Volunteer Service Work Hour Log signed by the adult responsible for overseeing the activity **AT THE TIME** of the activity. Hours will not be accepted retroactively.
- ★ Hours must be turned in to Ms. Andrea at the end of each academic semester (December & May). Hours not submitted at the end of the semester will be forfeited.

★ Community service projects will <u>not</u> be accepted if:

- They were completed before the summer before entering Grade 9 (Service hours may begin after the last day of 8th grade has commenced) or after high school graduation
- o If they were a part of a court-mandated community service
- Family-related activities or service to family members (ex: babysitting, completing assigned chores, etc.)
- Service for the sole benefit of a religious house of worship and/or its congregation.
 - Please note that activities sponsored by these organizations that benefit the community (ex: mission trips or community cleanup events) are acceptable for Bright Futures
- o Donations, such as Locks of Love or giving blood
- Service work that earns the student academic credit (except for credit earned through an approved service-learning course)
 - This includes being a Teacher Assistant (TA)
- o Activities, events, or organizations that require fees to be paid to participate
 - This includes school activities where students are required to pay to participate, including Prom, Homecoming, Dances, Lock-in, etc.
- An activity where there is no responsible adult or supervisor on site to evaluate and confirm student performance. Please note that parents/guardians are not able to supervise community service projects.

★ Other activities that may qualify as volunteering but not as community service for the purpose of the Bright Futures Scholarship include but are not limited to the following:

- Washing your elderly neighbor's car or mowing his lawn
- School/Club group-related events such as car washes or fundraisers
- o Babysitting for your neighbor
- Working in your parent's store or business
- Helping your pastor at your church with personal errands
- Church activities that benefit only the members of the church such as acolyte, altar server, lay reader, Vacation Bible School, working in a church nursery, or church choir
